

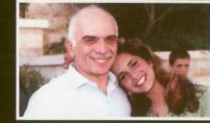

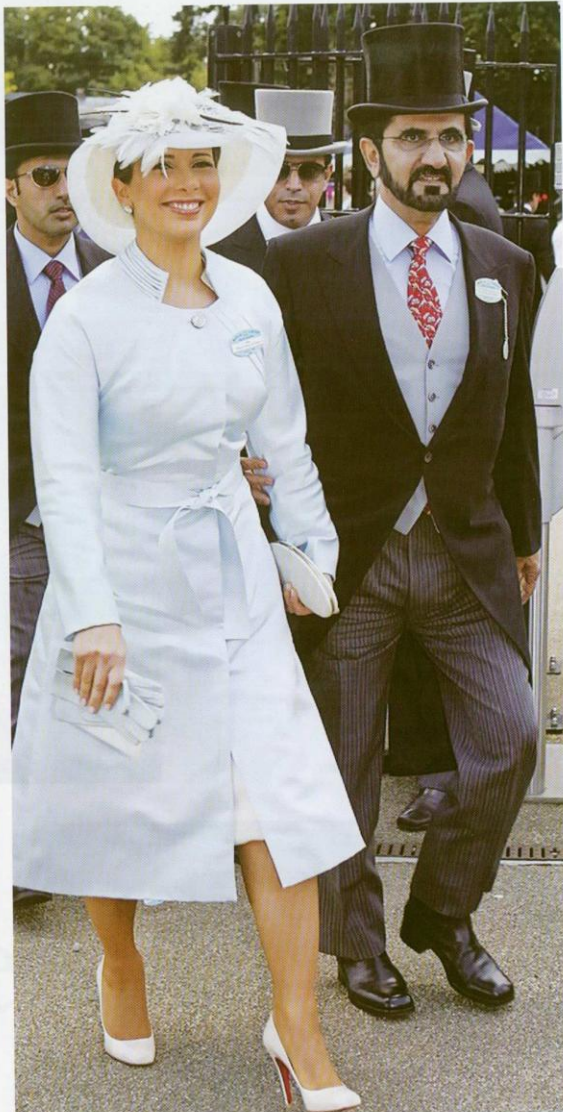

Her appointment was supported by former UN Secretary General Kofi Annan, makes her the second Goodwill Ambassador ever for the WFP. 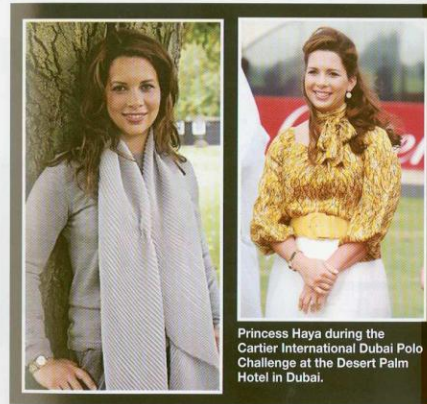
